

PURCHASING OF EMERGENCY GOODS

DIRECT CONTRACTING EVALUATION REPORT

1. Back ground

An earthquake occurred on Tuesday afternoon with an epicenter some 82 km below the surface in Iranian Balochistan. While there has been no loss of life in Iran, at least 27 injuries were reported. However, in Pakistan's Balochistan, dozens of villages on the Mashkhail area of Washuk district were damaged, while 24 people were killed by building collapses, which was measured at 7.8 on the Richter scale. It is noteworthy that the epicenter was in Iran, but the deaths occurred in Pakistan. It was the worst earthquake in Pakistan since the one that struck Azad Kashmir in 2005, and is another indication that the complex of mountains, consisting of the Himalayan Range and the mountain ranges of what amount to its foothills, are now seismically active. Recent trends have shown destructively violent earthquakes to be occurring at increasingly frequently.

2. Method of Procurement, Direct Contracting criteria.

In order to respond urgently and support relief and rehabilitation efforts some goods are required to be procured following Direct Contracting as per paragraph 3.7 (e) which can be resorted to "in response to natural disasters and emergency situations declared by the Borrower and recognized by the Bank,"

3. Specifications

The following specification summarizing the emergency and priority basis requirements.

Tents size 16 x 18' feet water proof.

Blankets Pakistan Made.

Chatai, Iran Made.

4. Market Survey and Contact numbers of the last time provided suppliers.

After detailed analysis and the report of the District Administration, PDMA Balochistan Purchase committee visited and contacted the people, shop keepers and General order suppliers to get the available stock details with specification and financial analysis. The Committee found following observations and analysis.

Due to security concerns none of the shop keepers stock the emergency use products

After visiting the Market, it was determined that there are only few shop keepers who have minimum stock of tents, chatai and blankets.

Many shop keepers having the quality and quantity of stock, which can be supplied in the affected area.

4.1 Analysis: QUERIES

1. None of the supplier s have the required quantity with required specification.

2. It may also be mentioned that the difference in unit rate of items though not very high but not matching with others s.
3. After information gathering it has been determined that, M/S Salam Traders, Shop No. 27, Ground Floor, swiss plaza near zehri Masjid, M.A Jinnah Road, Quetta Cantt, possess the required supplies with acceptable quality and quantity however rates are comparably high.
4. After long negotiations, the supplier agreed on a reasonable price.

5. Recommendations

1. The supplier can supply the required goods in one day.
2. We are also submitting rate analysis of other shop keeper and general orders suppliers and quality of the available stocks.

Based on above it is recommended that Bank may accord its NOL for Direct Contracting on following packages through following suppliers at the stated rates. Draft Purchase Orders attached:
